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## **NEEF & PwC Launch Free Financial Education for Public Lands Organizations**

Online Training to Increase Groups' Capacity to Support Lands

WASHINGTON, December 4, 2012 — To boost the capacity of public lands groups nationwide in supporting parks and other public lands, the National Environmental Education Foundation (NEEF) and PwC have launched free, online financial training at the Public Lands Every Day website, <a href="mailto:publiclandseveryday.org">publiclandseveryday.org</a>.

NEEF and PwC collaborated on the development of six learning modules to meet a growing need for knowledge of financial management and reporting among organizations known as public lands friends groups. The training is designed to help organizations monitor and manage their finances, successfully seek grants, and overall become more sustainable.

The online modules cover topics such as budgeting, filing a Form 990 IRS return, developing balance sheets and understanding different accounting methods. Users can dive into the topics at their own pace and in any order, based on their needs and interests.

"We are proud to be partners with PwC and together catalyze more public involvement with public lands through the educational and recreational activities, as well as volunteering events that these groups offer in their communities."
