Background

We are headquartered in Charles County, Maryland and most commonly known for providing unique year around tutorial and enrichment programs to the area's most vulnerable youth.





Vision

FNC creates a safe, fun, and nurturing environment at the most crucial hours when children are most vulnerable: after school and in the summer months. FNC encourages and supports children and teens' academic levels, self-esteem, confidence, self expression, and leadership skills through interactive and entertaining programs. Our desire is that we will play a role in

encouraging youth development both inside and outside the classroom so they may overcome obstacles and environments to fulfill personal goals and graduate from high school and move on to earning a higher education degree.

Highlighted Programs

- * Year-round Academic Programs: FNC offers 6-week academic oriented programs throughout the school year for elementary through middle school students. Programs include Homework Help, Math, and Reading and provide a positive and engaging environment for academic success.
- * **Summer 2012 C.A.M.P:** Three times a week for 5 weeks, fifty six 3rd—9th graders participated in our Math, Reading, and Science & Engineering programs. Twenty four volunteers led students through interactive activities including word games, book discussions, math relay competitions, electromagnet building and a rocket racer competition.
- * College & Career Preparation Workshops: Year-round interactive workshops led by professional experts to provide resources and motivation for higher education and career paths to high school students and their families.
- * Writing & Journaling Program: A 9-week program serving 6—8th graders that focused on improving writing skills through engaging writing projects including an imaginary city persuasive essay and invention project.
 - * African American History Program: This program was designed to educate youth about the importance of the civil rights movement and shed a spotlight on notable black people throughout history.
 - * Adopt a Grandparent Community Service Program: A monthly service program that sends youth volunteers to a local nursing home to provide companionship and support to a senior.
