Young Syrian-Americans Spend Two Weeks in Syria, Turkey

Nine activists visted refugee camps during SAC-sponsored trip from Dec. 25 to Jan. 4 to assess the humanitarian situation, deliver aid.

• The activists went to schools in refugee camps in Turkey to help teach English and visited rehabilitation centers for wounded people. They surveyed four different camps in Syria where refugees are in desperate need of help. "We saw how all people had to eat in one of the camps was one boiled potato per tent. That means families of ten or sometimes more are sharing one potato a day," said Kenan Rahmani, SAC board member and activist.

• The activists witnessed a horrifying attack in Tel Refaat when a TNT Barrel was dropped 500 meters away from them. Eighteen people were killed in that residential area from the same bomb.

• They met with leaders of the civilian administrative councils that are emerging across liberated areas to build relationships that will help with future aid delivery and management.
