## Shortened 48-Game NHL Schedule Gets Underway on Saturday

After nearly 120 days, the NHL lockout is finally over. The labor dispute between league owners and the player's union has reduced this year's NHL schedule for each team from 82 to 48 games. The lockout forced the cancellation of a total of 510 games that were originally slated on the NHL schedule.
