NCAA Tournament Parity Promises March Madness Will Ensue

The 2013 NCAA Tournament is just weeks from getting underway. For millions of Americans, the scouting process for upcoming March Madness office pools is well underway. Whether fans have been following since the start of the season or have just jumped in at the conclusion of the NFL season, the craziness across the college basketball landscape is impossible to miss.

Printable Brackets says this parity could lead to a new level of unpredictability in this year's NCAA basketball tournament.

The 2013 NCAA Basketball Tournament will begin with "First Four" play on Tuesday, March 19th in Dayton, Ohio. March Madness will begin in earnest on Thursday, March 21st. Sites for the second and third rounds include Austin, Texas, Kansas City, Missouri, Salt Lake City, Utah and Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Before the "Big Dance" gets underway, the conference tournaments will decide who receives automatic bids to the NCAA tournament. Printable Brackets has made complimentary ACC basketball tournament, Big Ten tournament, Big 12 tournament, Big East tournament and SEC tournament bracket sheets available to get fans ready.

"With the way the season has unfolded, automatic bids take on extra significance in this year's NCAA tournament," said Worth. "It appears as though there will be more teams on the bubble than ever before, so locking up an automatic spot can do wonders for a team's psyche."

The current favorites in Las Vegas to win the national championship include Indiana, Florida, Michigan, Duke and Miami.
