Adding to the excitement, NASCAR will also send NASCAR Sprint Cup Series driver **Ricky Stenhouse Jr**. and NASCAR rising star **Daniel Suárez** on a USO visit to Luke Air Force Base tomorrow, Feb. 28. Both drivers will relay their thanks, talk racing and answer questions

from military members and their families.

The USO first began working with NASCAR in 2011. Since then, they deployed a tour to Guantanamo Bay, Cuba and another to Kuwait and Germany - lifting the spirits of more than 1,000 troops and military families. This visit marks the first USO tour for Suárez and the second for Stenhouse Jr., who traveled to Kuwait and Germany in December 2012 and visited with more than 655 military personnel.

Born and raised in Mississippi, Stenhouse Jr. is the two-time and reigning NASCAR Nationwide Series champion. Now in his rookie NASCAR Sprint Cup Series season, Stenhouse Jr. raced in the Daytona 500 this past Sunday.

Daniel Suárez was born in Mexico and made his official NASCAR K&N Pro Series East debut in 2011. Now a member of NASCAR's "Next 9" initiative - a group of drivers identified by the industry as the next wave of young rising stars - he claimed his first NASCAR Toyota Series win on May 12, 2012, in Mexico City and has two K&N East top-five finishes to his credit.
