The camp is provided free of charge to all of its campers. Camp Kesem is a secular camp and is open to children of all races, religions, national origins, and financial statuses. It is an opportunity for campers to build self-esteem and gain support from peers facing similar challenges. Founded in 1880 by the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary, Holy Names Academy is an independent Catholic school for young women in grades 9-12 with an enrollment of 675.
