## Buddhist Recovery Techniques Take Center Stage at Freedom and Recovery Conference on April 6

Special Saturday workshop features Dave Smith, unconventional teacher of Buddhist recovery techniques to provide a stellar finish to the national conference focused on addiction treatment and recovery

In recovery himself, Dave knows the power of channeling energy into Buddhist exercises. His tattoos and rock-n'-roll attitude paint him as hardcore and authentic, and he is serious about promoting the Dharma Punx mentality. As a long time Buddhist practitioner, he has been working closely with recovering addicts for the last five years. Dave has extensive experience bringing meditative interventions into jails, prisons, youth detention, and addiction treatment facilities.

"We believe in the human capacity for transformation and change," Dave says.

"Drawing inspiration from the original teachings of the Buddha, we outline a program of recovery that says, 'All individuals have the power and potential to free themselves from suffering.' We feel confident in the power of the Buddha's teachings, if applied, to relieve suffering of all kinds, including the suffering of addiction."

Dave's 90-minute workshop at the Freedom and Recovery Conference will outline a program of Buddhist recovery. Attendees will learn how to define and implement

mindfulness meditation, discuss the core principles of Buddhist recovery and cultivate mind-body awareness.
