
Usage while watching TV is similar across devices

Overall, 87% of respondents reported multi-tasking on at least one 2nd screen device while watching TV

Device Usage while watching TV



- Compared to all other devices, laptops are most likely to be used while watching TV, regardless of the activity being performed.
- E-Readers, which often require singular focus, are, as expected, far less likely to be used while watching TV. For the large majority, it seems ereading is similar to reading a physical book in that both are done when the TV is turned off.


Note: A comparison of desktop vs. laptop usage and behavior showed no substantial differences between the two, so they are reported together throughout.

Where have I seen that actor before?

Overall, 47% of those who have used a 2nd screen device while watching TV have participated in a 2nd screen activity.

Chief among these is for people to use their device to glean additional info about the actor, actress, or show they are watching, likely as a way of making a connection to the show.
