Some of the largest family-owned dairy farms in New York State are found on the Adirondack Coast and help contribute to the 380 million pounds of milk produced by here annually; milk that you'll find in familiar products such as Ben and Jerry's Ice Cream, McCadam Cheese and various Cabot products including butter, cheese and Greek yogurt.
