## Richard Louv to Speak at National Marine Educators Association Conference

JOIN AUTHOR OF LAST CHILD IN THE WOODS AND THE NATURE PRINCIPLE
IN PRE-CONFERENCE TWITTER CHAT

Mobile, AL (PRWeb) June 17, 2013 – Richard Louv, recipient of the Audubon Medal, accomplished journalist, and author of eight books about the connections between family, nature and community, will serve as the keynote speaker for the National Marine Educators Association (NMEA) Conference in Mobile, Alabama on July 22, 2013. Louv's national best seller, Last Child in the Woods: Saving Our Children From Nature-Deficit Disorder, and most recent book, The Nature Principle: Reconnecting with Life in a Virtual Age, have stimulated an international conversation about the relationship between children and nature, a topic of particular interest to marine science education professionals. In a time when obesity, attention disorders and depression are on the rise, Mr. Louv offers inspiration for people of all ages to reflect on the direct connection between the natural world and quality of life.
