

Adventure Teen Challenge 2013

Inclusive Multi-Team Sports for Youth





World T.E.A.M. Sports' inclusive 2013 Adventure Teen Challenge engages developmentally disabled and able-bodied teenagers from across the Washington D.C. metropolitan area in an epic weekend of competitive team sporting events.

Partnering with Dreams for Kids and Push America, the Challenge provides an opportunity for disabled teens aged 13 to 18 to participate with able-bodied boys and girls as teams. Each team will work together to successfully complete each stage of the multisport event to cross the finish line together. Held in Washington, D.C. and Potomac County, Maryland, in the scenic Chesapeake and Ohio Canal National Historical Park along the banks of the Potomac River, the participating teams in the Challenge will include one disabled and one able-bodied teen. Through inclusive competition, disabled participants build confidence and serves as a role model for others, as well as inspiring all competitors and spectators.

The **2013** Adventure Teen Challenge is scheduled to begin with a mile hike for participants along the Potomac River. Next, the teams will transition to mountain bikes for a seven mile ride along the unpaved tow path following the historic C & O Canal. After completing the ride, the teams climb into canoes for the water segment of the challenge – a half mile paddle along the Canal back to Fletcher's Cove Boathouse.

Nearly 100 persons participated in the inaugural 2011 event, including athletes and volunteers. The 2013 Challenge is anticipated to have similar attendance. Partners include Bikes to Borrow, the Boathouse at Fletcher's Cove, Subway of the Bethesda Naval Hospital and Edible Arrangements.
