David Sedaris Returns to The Hanover Theatre on October 22 Generously sponsored by Fallon Community Health Plan

Worcester, MA (June 27, 2013)— Generously sponsored by Fallon Community Health Plan, David Sedaris makes his return to The Hanover Theatre for the Performing Arts in Worcester on Tuesday, October 22 at 7:30pm. Celebrating the release of his highly anticipated newest title, "Let's Explore Diabetes with Owls," which debuted at #1 on the New York Times bestseller list this April, Sedaris will entertain audiences with engaging recollections, featuring all-new readings. Tickets to AN EVENING WITH DAVID SEDARIS are currently on sale to members of The Hanover Theatre before going on sale to the general public on Friday, June 28 at 10am.

David Sedaris, best known for sardonic humor and incisive social critiques, has become one of NPR's most popular and humorous commentators. Sedaris' works including *Barrel Fever* and *Holidays on Ice*, as well as collections of personal essays, "Naked," "Me Talk Pretty One Day," "Dress Your Family in Corduroy and Denim," and "When You Are Engulfed in Flames," have landed on the bestsellers list. There are a total of seven million copies of his books in print and they have been translated into 25 languages. He was the editor of *Children Playing Before a Statue of Hercules: An Anthology of Outstanding Stories*. Sedaris' pieces appear regularly in *The New Yorker* and have twice been included in "The Best American Essays."

He and his sister, Amy Sedaris, have collaborated under the name "The Talent Family" and have written half-a-dozen plays including *Stump the Host, Stitches, One Woman Shoe,* which received an Obie Award, *Incident at Cobbler's Knob,* and *The Book of Liz,* which was published in book form by Dramatists Play Service. Sedaris' original radio pieces can often be heard on "This American Life." David Sedaris has been nominated for three Grammy Awards for Best Spoken Word and Best Comedy Album.
