2013 US Senate Productivity and Quality Award for Virginia Recipient and Forum for Excellence Announced

The National Reconnaissance Office Media Services Center to be recognized at the 31th Annual Virginia Forum for Excellence September 16-17, 2013 in Richmond, VA - the State's premier educational event for performance improvement professionals in Virginia and the District of Columbia based on the Baldrige Criteria for Performance Excellence.

(Richmond, Virginia) The National Reconnaissance Office (NRO) Media Services Center (MSC) has been named a **Medallion Award** recipient by the Panel of Judges for the U.S. Senate Productivity and Quality Award Program for Virginia and District of Columbia (Virginia SPQA). NRO/MSC is a joint Department of Defense — Intelligence Community organization headquartered in Chantilly, Virginia. NRO/MSC provides video production, graphic design, 3-D animation, detailed warfighter scene visualization, satellite coverage mapping, computerbased training development, website design, software application development, printing, and a variety of other multimedia products and services in support of national security. The Medallion Award is Virginia SPQA's highest of three award levels for performance excellence. Virginia SPQA award applicants undergo a rigorous examination by an independent board of examiners in seven areas defined by the Baldrige Criteria for Performance Excellence: leadership; strategic planning; customer focus; measurement analysis & knowledge management; workforce focus; operations focus; and performance results. The evaluation process includes approximately 1,000 hours of review and an on-site visit by a team of Virginia SPQA examiners. Award winners are selected by an independent panel of judges based on the criteria established for each award level.

Thousands of organizations worldwide use the Baldrige Criteria to guide their operations, improve performance and achieve sustainable results.

NRO/MSC along with other Virginia SPQA Program participants will be recognized by the Honorable Bill Bolling, Lieutenant Governor, Commonwealth of Virginia during a special

ceremony at the 2013 Virginia Forum for Excellence.

The Virginia Forum for Excellence is the state's premier event for performance improvement professionals. The 2013 theme is "Using the Baldrige Criteria to Drive Intelligent Risk, Sustainability and Results." September 16 showcases pre-forum workshops on the using intelligent risk methods and understanding the Baldrige Criteria for Performance Excellence. September 17 includes 12 workshops devoted to intelligent risk, sustainability and results plus keynote addresses from Thomas Sabolsky, Chief of the National Reconnaissance Office Media Services Center and Dennis Vonderfecht, President and CEO of Mountain States Health Alliance, recipient of the 2012 Virginia SPQA Medallion.
