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TESOL TO HOLD EDUCATIONAL EVENTS IN CAMEROON, BRAZIL, AND CHINA

Alexandria, VA (30 July 2013) — <u>TESOL International Association</u> will be holding three international events for English language educators, administrators, policy makers, and researchers this year. The events will take place in <u>Yaoundé, Cameroon</u>; <u>São Paulo, Brazil</u>; and <u>Guangzhou, China</u>. Each event is a one-to-two-day regional program held in collaboration with a TESOL affiliate, and all provide participants a unique opportunity to meet face-to-face with leading experts in the field on a specific topic or issue.

The acronym TESOL stands for Teachers of English to Speakers of Other Languages, a professional association for English language educators engaged in the field of English as a second or foreign language.

"As an international community, it is important for us to advance the field and address the needs of English language learners and professionals worldwide through events like these," noted TESOL Executive Director Rosa Aronson.

The symposium in Yaoundé, Cameroon, will be held 12 August at Université Catholique d'Afrique Centrale UCCAS—Ekounou Yaounde prior to the 2013 CAMELTA Conference. TESOL has worked closely with the Cameroon English Language and Literature Teachers Association (CAMELTA) to provide a rich program focusing on K–12 teacher development and training.

The symposium will address how teacher trainers can most effectively prepare the next generation of teachers, how working teachers at all levels can improve their English language proficiency, and how K–12 teachers can improve their practice through enhanced professionalism, peer-to-peer learning and networking, and ongoing professional development.

On 27–28 September 2013, TESOL will go to the <u>Universidade Metodista de São Paulo</u> in <u>São Paulo</u>, <u>Brazil</u>, for the international academy <u>"English for Specific Purposes"</u> (ESP).

Organized by TESOL, in partnership with its Brazil affiliate <u>BRAZ-TESOL</u> and the <u>São Paulo State</u> <u>Association of Teachers of English</u> (APLIESP), this academy combines lively plenary sessions and knowledge-sharing opportunities with hands-on workshop training.

Workshop topics include ESP curriculum development, teaching business English, ESP assessment and program delivery, English in the hospitality industry, English for job hunters, and much more.

The symposium in <u>Guangzhou</u>, <u>China</u>, will be held 15–16 November at <u>Guangdong University of Foreign Studies</u>, and will focus on envisioning and creating the future for English language teaching and learning.

Together with Guangdong University of Foreign Studies, TESOL has compiled a comprehensive program focused on English language teaching (ELT) in China. Participants will consider what constitutes effective practice, especially in China, given today's rapid pace of change; how they can rethink ELT to ensure its relevance and effectiveness in meeting student's needs; and how ELT professionals can work together more effectively to implement change and provide support for both teachers and students.
