3. Boot and Boat

Explore new territory with this hike that will follow an ATV trail and old portage through crown land and past beautiful beaver ponds to one of the many bays on Three Brothers Lake. You will then follow a snowmobile and sometimes muddy trail to the edge of the Three Brother's river where you will be picked up by for a scenic boat ride back to Big Hawk Marina. 4. Can you Dig it?

Calling all rock hounds! This hike follows a bush road for a couple of kilometres to two mineral collecting sites on Gibson Road. The first site is an abandoned mine where apatite was extracted. The second site requires some digging to discover apatite and titanite mineral samples in the soil and rock crevices. Most of the time will be spent exploring the two sites. Please bring along a trowel or small garden rake/hand shovel. You will take mineral samples home! Suitable for adults, youth and children 8 years +

5. Wetland Ways

How did a 10,000-year-old glacier help shape today's wetlands? This hike will lead you through time as you visit a series of wetlands ranging from a marsh to a Black Spruce bog. Get up close and personal with an esker and view the wetlands from this ancient elevated riverbed. Come and join us for some soggy boot fun, enjoying the beauty that this area has to offer while learning about various wetland inhabitants including beavers, pitcher plants and bogeymen! Turn left and continue another 5km to Lochlin Rd. Turn left again onto Lochlin Rd and follow above directions. Distance from Minden is approximately 15

6. On Anson Mountain

Did you know that part of the Ganaraska Hiking Trail is in the Haliburton Highlands? This trek will explore a new loop of the Ganaraska that will take you up to the top of "Anson Mountain". From here you will have lunch and enjoy the view of Devil's Lake and the rugged landscapes of the new Queen Elizabeth Provincial Park. Much of the terrain is rocky. Good hiking boots are a must and a hiking stick is recommended. Be sure to bring a lunch. Suitable for adults and older youth

7. A Basket Case

Take a walk with Sheila Ziman, naturalist and basket maker extraordinaire, to identify plants and discuss their use in basketry and/or in garden projects such as trellises and fencing. You will walk along the Haliburton County Rail Trail passing wetlands and forests where you will see materials growing in their preferred habitats. Sustainable gathering will be discussed and you will be treated to a demonstration of a basketry project using materials that have been gathered during the walk. Suitable for adults and older youth.

11. Way Back in Wilberforce

Discover the heritage of Wilberforce. You will stroll along Burleigh Road, one of Ontario's colonization roads, along the shore of Dark (Pusey) Lake across from the former IB&O railway, and through the hamlet with stops at Ontario's first Red Cross Outpost (National Historic site), an old fashioned general store (Agnew's), an old church (St. Margaret's), and a 100+ year old school (Wilberforce Elementary School). This hike explores part of the Prospector's Trail, a new trail recently developed by the Municipality of Highlands East. Suitable for adults, youth, and children.
