Prince Albert II of Monaco Foundation

In 2006, following in the environmentally-friendly footsteps of his forefathers, H.S.H. Prince Albert II created the Prince Albert II of Monaco Foundation, dedicated to the protection of the global environment. The Foundation focuses on three major challenges: climate change and developing renewable energies; the loss of biodiversity; and water management (improving universal access to clean water and fighting desertification). By 2010, the Foundation had extended its international outreach by opening chapters in Switzerland, the United Kingdom, France, Germany, Italy, Canada, and the United States. To date, more than 125 projects across the globe have been selected as recipients of grants totaling in excess of \$23 million. www.PA2F.org
