Mr. President, Mr. Speaker, Mr. Reid, Mr. Durbin, Ms. Pelosi, and Mr. Cantor:

Take notice: we are subpoending the named government officers above to appear before the court of the people to spur an open discussion on the future of our state.

The system, as it is, has failed us. Until it can function effectively, the public must reclaim our decisionmaking power. We elected you that you may hear our concerns and direct the collective energy of the Nation to do good within the world. We put you in those seats, and we are more than prepared to yank them out from under you.
