## Experts Will Convene This Week in Chicago to Discuss Impact of Immunotherapy and Biologics on Allergy Patient Care

World Allergy Organization Symposium Will Focus on Emerging Fields of Disease Treatment

<u>Milwaukee, WI, USA – December 10</u>. Experts in the field of allergy and clinical immunology from around the world will convene in Chicago from December 13-14, 2013 for the *WAO Symposium on Immunotherapy and Biologics*, hosted by the World Allergy Organization (WAO). "The Symposium will highlight the most recent advances and recommendations on biologics and immunotherapy including sublingual immunotherapy and other novel forms of immunotherapy that will have a major impact on the current and future management of allergic diseases and asthma. As we better understand the complexity and phenotypes of these diseases, new diagnostic tools and more targeted therapies are required to meet the growing challenges of the severe and complex forms of these diseases." said Ruby Pawankar, MD, PhD, WAO President and Symposium Chair.
