Dear Acting Attorney General John Jay Hoffman,

In October 2010, your office purportedly settled a suit against Wells Fargo in which, according to your press release, you obtained certain benefits for the citizens of New Jersey. Included in the benefits that your office claimed to have obtained for the citizens of New Jersey were loan modifications worth \$67,000,000.00 and procedures to allow them to keep their homes.

Wells Fargo has not provided the citizens of New Jersey the benefits that you purported to have obtained. Your total inaction in response to our multiple attempts to present this serious problem raises the very distressing question: Were you knaves or fools?

We hope that your office was duped and that you will redress Wells Fargo's disregard of the citizens of New Jersey and the many clients that we represent. If you do not respond to this third notification we will be forced to conclude the worst.
