



The average 911 response time is 10 minutes nationwide, whereas the average violent crime takes only 90 seconds.

Mayday Alarm utilizes your location to put out a call for help to qualified responders nearby.

Select your desired aid level from a variety of users, ranging from off duty military and trained EMT, to the average good samaritan.



Once help has been requested, audio is streamed from your phone that allows responders to get up-to-date information about what is happening at the scene.

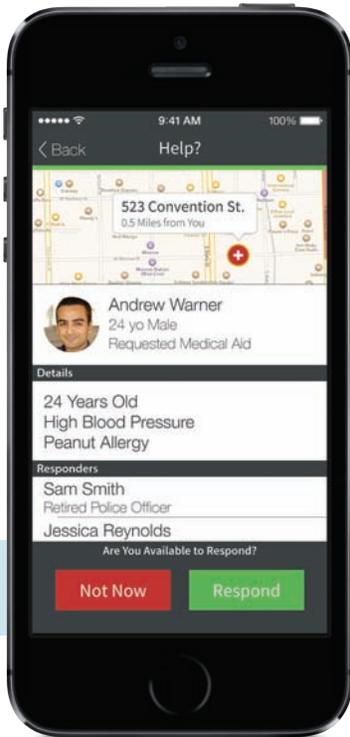
Details on the responders are shown, and allow you to judge whether they possess the appropriate skills for the situation.

Responding to Help Requests



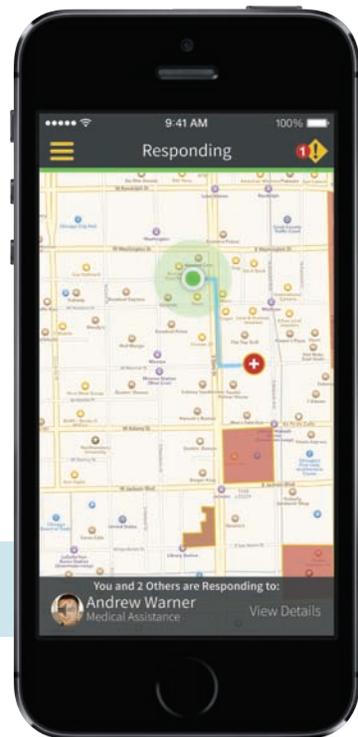
Mayday Alarm responders are able to view the details of a help request, including any relevant medical information such as allergies and known conditions.

A responder can also view the details of any current responders to a request to decide if the situation is already being adequately responded to.



Once a help request has been accepted, responders are presented with a map displaying the quickest route to the scene, in addition to the location of any fellow responders and concealed carry restricted zones.

Details of the incident and user requesting aid are available at any time, and the audio stream from the incident location may be toggled by the responder.
