ABOUT LSCFA

For 20 years, your Austin-area Clean Cities coalition has helped clear the air through various projects such as migrating City vehicles onto alternative fuels, converting much of the booming landscaping industry here in Austin and across Texas to propane mowers, encouraging AE customers to ride electric bikes and scooters, assisting local fleets to plan for alternative fuels, and much more. In 1994, under the City of Austin, Austin Clean Cities was the 6th coalition to join the U.S. DOE Clean Cities Program and the first City to join that was in attainment for air quality. In 2000, the coalition rebranded to Central Texas Clean Cities, covering Bastrop, Caldwell, Hays, Travis and Williamson counties to support the region's Air Quality efforts. Later, Ft. Hood joined the coalition, followed by the City of Temple. In 2012, the coalition reorganized into a DOE-recognized, membership-based non-profit coalition and changed the name to Lone Star Clean Fuels Alliance (LSCFA). In 2012, our stakeholders reduced petroleum consumption by 1.6 million gallons, reducing GHG emissions by 10 tons, which is counted in the region's air quality reporting.
