

Integration of Behavioral Health and Primary Care to be Featured at APA Annual Meeting in New York City, May 3 – 7

ARLINGTON, Va. (April 23, 2014) The theme of this year's American Psychiatric Association's <u>Annual Meeting</u> is **Changing the Practice and Perception of Psychiatry** and one major area of practice change is the increasing integration of behavioral health and primary care, in part fueled by implementation of the Affordable Care Act. The APA <u>Annual Meeting</u>, the world's largest psychiatric meeting, will run Saturday, May 3 to Wednesday, May 7, 2014 in New York City at the Javits Convention Center.

The APA recently released a <u>new study</u> on the economics of integrated care and hosted a forum on this topic <u>on</u> <u>April 4</u> in Washington, DC. APA President Jeffrey Lieberman, MD, noted at that meeting, "40% of patients seek behavioral health care in primary care. This is a natural area of collaboration between psychiatrists and other physicians, particularly primary care. Behavioral health is an integral part of overall health."

This year's Annual Meeting is offering more than 20 presentations in an Integrated Care Track that covers the full spectrum of collaboration presented by experts from across the field. In addition, there are several presentations on workforce development, particularly for residency training.
