TESOL International Association Installs New Board Members

New board members serve 3-year terms beginning at the TESOL International Convention & English Language Expo. The 2014 convention was held 26–29 March. Ryuko Kubota, <u>University of British Columbia</u>, was also confirmed by the Board as 2015 Toronto, Ontario Convention Program Chair. Dr. Kubota will serve for a one-year term on the Board of Directors.
