



DRAPER NATURAL HISTORY MUSEUM

- Buffalo Bill Center of the West: a museum complex begun in 1927 to celebrate the spirit of the American West; its focus is western history; firearms; western art; nature and science of the Yellowstone region; and Plains Indian history and culture.
- Cody, Wyoming: **founded by William F. "Buffalo Bill" Cody; lies 50 miles east of Yellowstone National Park.**
- William F. Cody (1846 – 1917): a man who lived the Old West with buffalo hunting, Pony Express, his Wild West arena show, and an entrepreneur who founded Cody, Wyoming.
- Yellowstone National Park: **America's first national park founded in 1872;** located in northwest Wyoming, 50 miles from Cody.
- Draper Natural History Museum: Nature and science of the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem
- Bruce Eldredge: Center of the West Executive Director.
- Dr. Charles R. Preston: Curator, Draper Natural History Museum.
