Buffalo Bill Center of the West: a museum complex begun in 1927 to celebrate the spirit of the American West; its focus is western history; firearms; western art; nature and science of the Yellowstone region; and Plains Indian history and culture.

Cody, Wyoming: founded by William F. "Buffalo Bill" Cody; lies 50 miles east of Yellowstone National Park.

William F. Cody (1846 – 1917): a man who lived the Old West with buffalo hunting, Pony Express, his Wild West arena show, and an entrepreneur who founded Cody, Wyoming.

Yellowstone National Park: America's first national park founded in 1872; located in northwest Wyoming, 50 miles from Cody.
