PERKINS EASTMAN'S DUNBAR HIGH SCHOOL AND SOUTHWEST WATERFRONT RECEIVE AWARDS, DISTINCTION FROM CONGRESS FOR THE NEW URBANISM

Dunbar Wins for Best Building (Civic), Southwest for Best Neighborhood Plan; All CNU Charter Award Winners Honored June 5 at Ceremony in Buffalo, NY

Washington, DC (June 6, 2014) The Washington, DC office of top design and architecture firm Perkins Eastman is pleased to announce that two distinctive area projects—Dunbar Senior High School and The Wharf: Southwest Waterfront—are recipients of 2014 Charter Awards in two out of thirteen categories from the Congress for the New Urbanism (CNU). Dunbar High School, which opened to students in August 2013 and is slated to achieve LEED Platinum certification, won in the category of Best Building, Civic; Southwest Waterfront, which broke ground in March 2014, won in the category of Best Neighborhood Plan.

The Charter Awards recognize excellence in urban design, from regional and neighborhood plans to urban buildings. This year's winners were selected in January by a jury of distinguished designers, architects, planners and scholars, all led by Jury Chair Jeff Speck AICP, who presented the awards Thursday evening, June 5, at the CNU 22 Awards Ceremony in Buffalo, New York. Perkins Eastman Principal Matthew Bell FAIA and Associate Principal Hilary Bertsch AIA were in attendance.

"The new [Paul Laurence] Dunbar High School is remarkable in so many ways," says Speck. "It reintroduces a street that was megablocked out of existence by the building it replaced...and it opens up all of its non-classroom spaces for use by the community at large, creating a new heart for its neighborhood." The new 280,000 gsf school was designed to pay homage to historic elements of the original building (Dunbar was founded in 1870 as the nation's first African-American public school) while establishing a new benchmark for sustainable, high-performance school design, which includes a geothermal system, 482 kW photovoltaic array, two 20,000-gallon cisterns, low VOC materials, and underground parking. Principals Matthew Bell FAIA and Sean O'Donnell AIA, LEED AP led the Dunbar design team.

Washington, DC's mixed-use Southwest Waterfront development, aka The Wharf, is designed on the premise of reconnecting the city with its waterfront and creating a place that residents can be proud to call their own. Stretched across 27 land acres and 24 water acres, with 1.9 million gsf of building area comprising the first of three phases alone, this neighborhood revival has long been a glimmer in DC residents' eyes and now construction is underway, with a projected completion date of 2017 for Phase 1. The entire development is targeted for LEED-ND Gold, with all new buildings planned to achieve a minimum of LEED Silver. Perkins Eastman is serving as Master Planner, Design Architect and Architect of Record for the public realm, infrastructure and buildings in two of the initial parcels. Principal Stan Eckstut FAIA and Associate Principal Hilary Bertsch AIA are leading the design team.

Recognizing outstanding architectural, landscape and urban designs built in harmony with their physical and social contexts, the Charter Awards have honored projects from Andorra to South Africa, Beijing to San Antonio.
