





















National Latino, Asian American and Pacific Islander, Labor and Faith Leaders to Release 2014 National Immigration Score Card

In midst of national immigration crisis, groups begin civic engagement with Score Cards showing how Congress turned its back on communities

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Frustrated by Congress' refusal to enact immigration reform as our nation grapples with a national immigration crisis, an unprecedented coalition of national Latino and Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) civic engagement and civil rights groups, labor and faith leaders, will hold a press conference on Monday, July 28, to release the 2014 National Immigration Score Card.

Leaders of 10 groups will discuss how Congress failed to address the moral crisis created by the nation's broken immigration system. Instead of responsibly addressing immigration as demanded by the public, labor, business, faith and civil rights advocates, the House has voted for the immediate deportation of "DREAMers" and led attacks against children refugees.

The 2014 National Immigration Score Card reviewed all 435 House members on congressional actions, including votes on legislation and amendments on the issue of immigration, cosponsorships of key immigration related bills that include a path to citizenship, and public statements that declare support for immigration reform with a path to citizenship and family reunification through visa reform.
