Brain Aneurysm Facts







- An estimated 6 million people in the U.S. have an unruptured brain aneurysm.
- About 30,000 people in the U.S. suffer a ruptured brain aneurysm each year – roughly 1 rupture every 18 minutes.
- Nearly 40% of ruptured brain aneurysm cases are fatal. About 66% of survivors suffer some permanent deficit.
- Women are 50% more likely suffer from brain aneurysms than men.
- Almost 500,000 deaths are caused globally each year by brain aneurysms. Half of these victims are under 50.
- While people between the ages of 35 and 60 have the greatest risk for developing brain aneurysms, children can as well. The median age when brain aneurysm ruptures occur is 50, and there are typically no warning signs.
- Ruptured brain aneurysms account for 3 to 5% of all new strokes.
