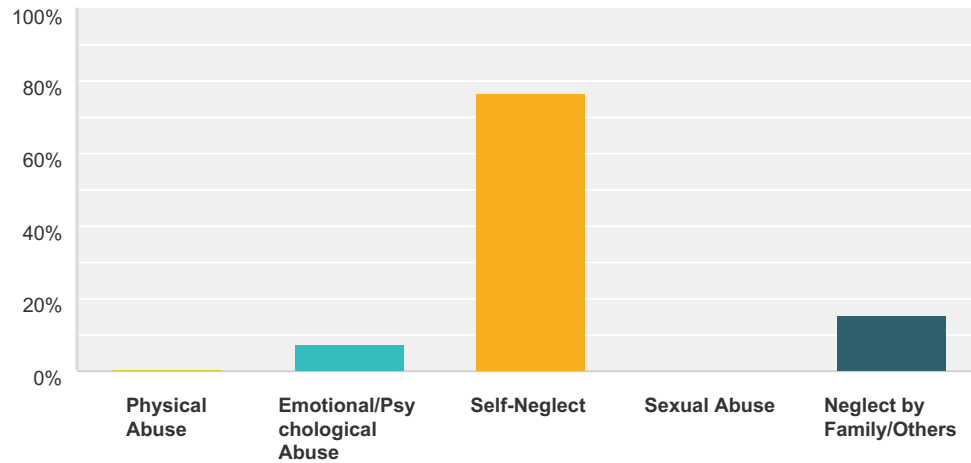


Q1 What type of non-financial elder abuse/neglect do you encounter most often in your practice? (PLEASE SELECT ONE.)

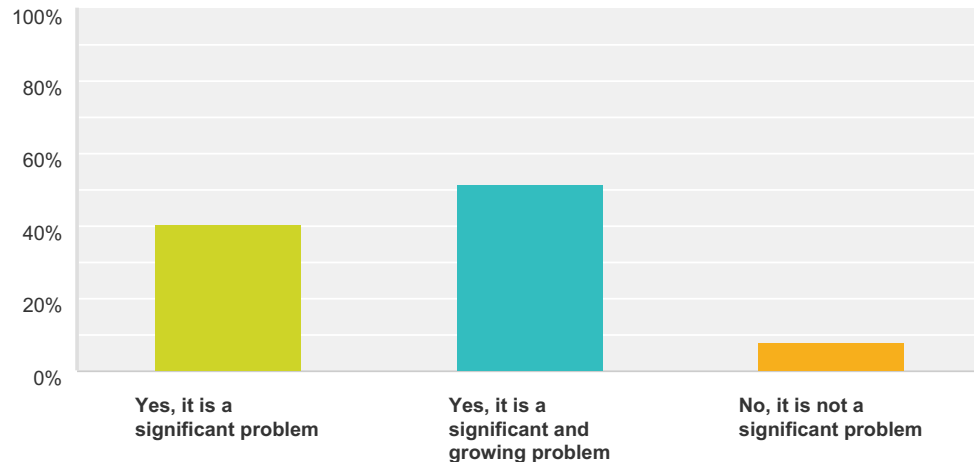

(PLEASE SELECT ONE.)**

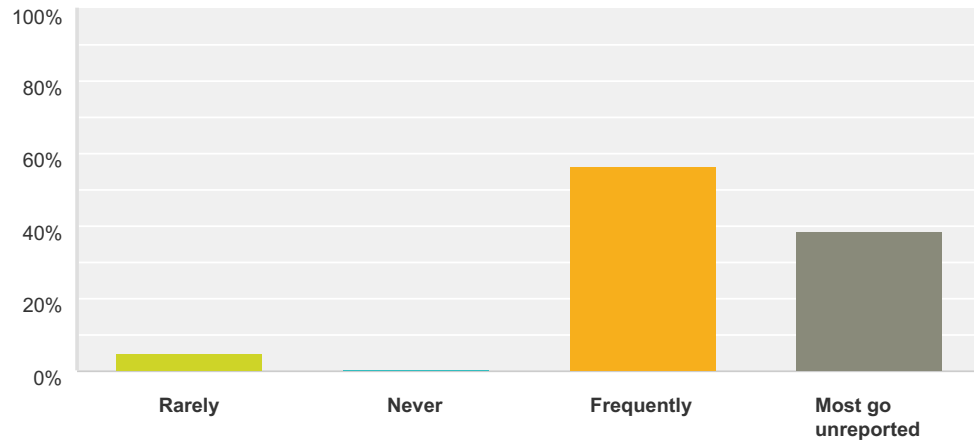

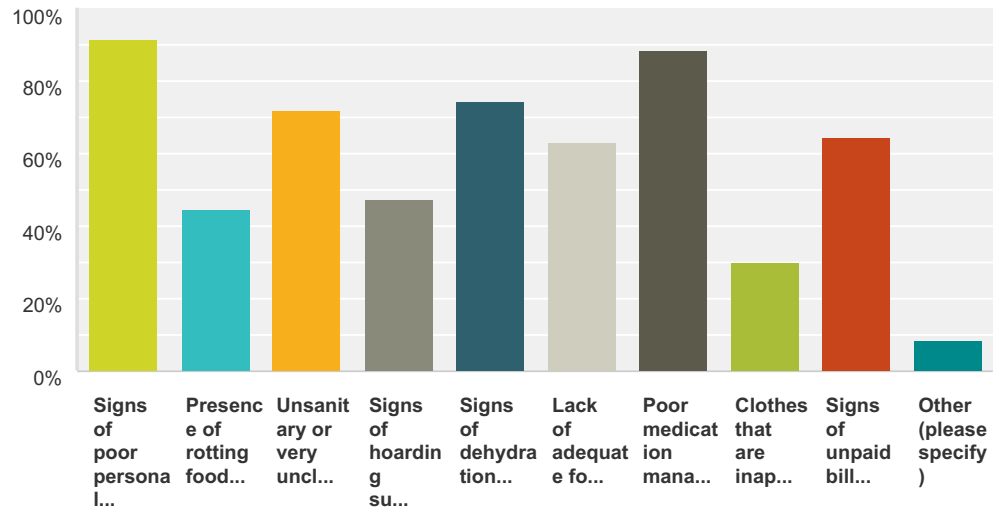
