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## New Books From TESOL Press

Randolph explore effective ways to address idioms, collocations, multiword phrases, and other types of formulaic language in the classroom. They present recent research on the pedagogy of teaching and learning idioms along with practical tools for teachers, including ready-to-use lesson plans and resource materials.

Authors Shawna Shapiro, Raichle Farrelly, and Zuzana Tomaš use quotes, anecdotes, and reflection questions to discover the needs of international students. They offer specific strategies, resources, and activities that serve as tools for responding to common instructional challenges, making it both informative and practical.

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Another recent release is <u>Teaching for Academic Purposes</u>, which is part of the <u>English</u> <u>Language Teacher Development Series</u> edited by Thomas S. C. Farrell. In this easy-tofollow guide, authors Ilka Kostka and Susan Olmstead-Wang show how learning academic language can be achieved by developing a set of skills that can be honed with practice, effective instruction, and motivation.
