



OVERVIEW

The evolution of Medical Ministry International began in 1968 when volunteers journeyed to the Dominican Republic to serve the poor and provide basic medical care. This concept has evolved into a worldwide organization focused on providing life-changing, capacity building programs to the developing world.

In 2012, MMI provided direct services to more than 543,000 people, valued at more than US \$82 million.

Medical Ministry International operates in more than 23 countries, utilizing Health Centers, Residency Training Programs, and Project Teams to provide immediate health care and capacity building programs. MMI works to support and strengthen local systems, providing a variety of opportunities and training necessary for the long-term impact on those we serve. We are intentional to not create a “welfare” mentality, but insist on the active involvement of the local community to “help them, help themselves”. MMI is a development organization seeking to focus on the root cause of disease and address the lack of medical services in the developing world. Activities are strategically designed and based on analysis and tangible statistical data provided by in-country teams at the point of service.

- Integrated Health and Education
- Medical Care
- Surgical Care
- Obstetric and Women’s Health Care
- Orthopedics & Physical Therapy Care
- Vision Care
- Water, Sanitation, & Agriculture

Services are provided to women, men, girls, and boys regardless of religious affiliations, ethnic backgrounds, ability to pay, or other factors.

MMI strives for excellence in all that we say and do. The International Office provides operational support, as well as accountability, and strategic oversight for all organizational activities. Facilities that are a part of the MMI Network of hospitals, clinics, etc. are held to the highest of standards and provide a regular source of statistical information that allows MMI to optimize its resources and provide a significant return for the people, organizations, and foundations that support our work.

The organization is intentional in its strategy to build infrastructure and medical services for the poorest of the poor.
