

## Harris Study Fact Sheet - Heartbleed 1-Year Anniversary

- 1) Have you ever heard of Heartbleed?
  - 86% No
- 2) If you have heard of Heartbleed, which of the following online security precautions did you take within the 30 days following the arrival of the Heartbleed bug in April of 2014?
  - 49% Changed at least (1) password
- 3) How strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement: I would rather have explicit photos and/or video of me posted online than have hackers steal \$1,000 from my bank account.
  - 43% Strongly/somewhat agree
  - 53% (of all Males) Strongly/somewhat agree
  - 65% (of all Females) Strongly/somewhat disagree
- 4) Which of the following types of personal information, if any, would you be most concerned with online hackers gaining access to?
  - 45% My social security number
  - 27% My personal banking information
  - 13% My credit card number
  - 1% My private emails
  - 1% My personal Internet browsing history
- 5) In the year following Heartbleed, how strongly do you agree or disagree with the following statement: The Obama administration has done less than corporations have to protect me from hackers, breaches, and online security threats.
  - 65% Strongly/somewhat agree
- 6) Which of the following organizations, if any, do you expect will do the best job at protecting you from hackers, breaches and online security threats?
  - 32% Myself
  - 24% Not sure
  - 23% Technology companies
  - 3% Corporations
  - 3% Government
  - 1% President Obama

## Methodology

This survey was conducted online within the United States by Harris Poll on behalf of Dashlane from March 10-12, 2015 among 2,014 adults ages 18 and older. This online survey is not based on a probability sample and therefore no estimate of theoretical sampling error can be calculated.
