

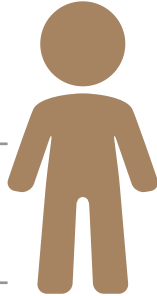

OVERVIEW FACTS

More than **3 million** youth have received services funded by Salesian Missions.



Programs in more than **130** countries

To date, more than **6 million** Americans, in the both the public and private sector, have helped make these programs possible through their generous donations



82% of all donations go directly to programs that help those most in need.

The most recent data shows that in 2009, Salesian Missions has carried out **62 projects** worth **\$69.7 million** in financial support.

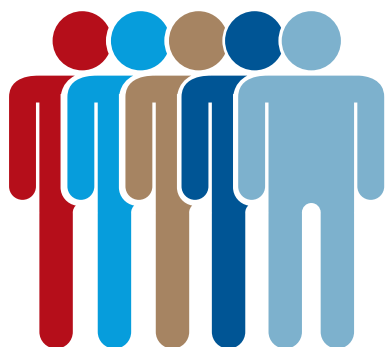

Program Development:

Salesians are able to design innovative and customized programs that address the specific needs in the communities they serve.



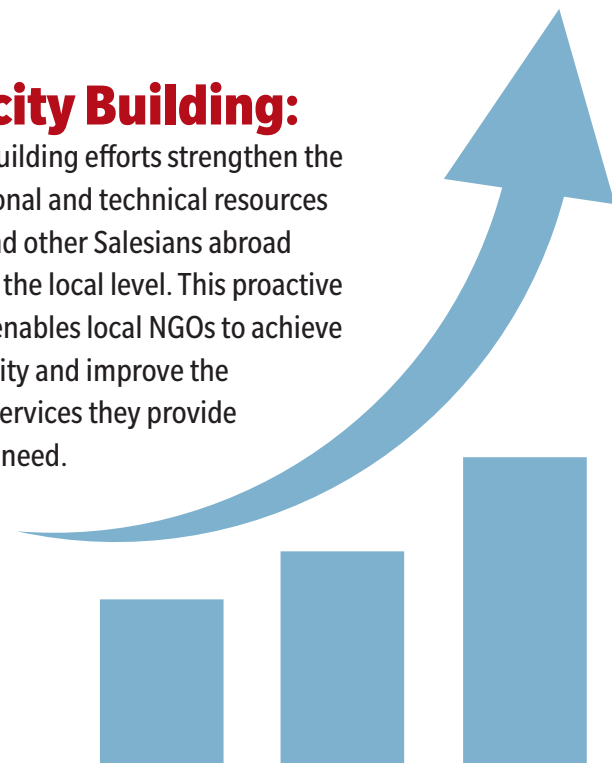
Partnerships: Strong partnerships with U.S. government, private-sector organizations, in-kind financial supports and the millions of American donors who financially contribute to the Salesians important work.

Property and Logistics Program: Salesian programs are the recipient of generous in-kind support that aids programs and benefits poor youth and their families. They are able to leverage their USAID Ocean Freight Reimbursement Grant to deliver these humanitarian aid shipments to their overseas destinations.



Capacity Building:

Capacity building efforts strengthen the organizational and technical resources of NGOs and other Salesians abroad working at the local level. This proactive approach enables local NGOs to achieve sustainability and improve the quality of services they provide to those in need.



Infrastructure Development: Salesian build schools, youth shelters, hospitals and other critical infrastructure to aid in the development of their programs and help communities in which they serve.
