He worked in the farm with his grandfather and sold the crops at the open market. Coming from a poor family, he knew early on that going to school was his long-term ticket to a better life. Clinically blind, the young Apl managed to get treatment for his eyes in the U.S. through the Pearl S. Buck Foundation with his sponsor, **Joe Ben Hudgens, who eventually adopted Apl**. At the age of 14 years old, Apl moved to LA where Hudgens fostered the importance of education that would lead to achieving his dreams. **Apl became a rapper, record producer, and member of the multi-Grammy award winning group the Black Eyed Peas**. Drawing from his own life experiences and putting action behind his words, he established **the Apl.de.ap Foundation**.
