

JOHN MIX STANLEY REDISCOVERED AN ARTIST'S LEGACY RISES FROM THE ASHES <u>Symposium</u> Cody, Wyoming, May 11, 2015

The exhibition, <u>Painted Journeys: The Art of John Mix Stanley</u>, presented as an artistic and geographical journey, is soon on view in the Special Exhibition Gallery, located in the lower level of the Buffalo Bill Center of the West, Cody, Wyoming, June 6 – August 29, 2015.

Along with the exhibition opening, individuals may attend a symposium about Stanley on June 6. Cost for the symposium is \$65, with a special rate of \$55 for Center of the West members.
