Rules:

- Log onto goadirondack.com/geo to download a passport and retrieve the coordinates and location information for the geocaches, or pick up a passport at the Adirondack Coast Visitors Bureau.
- Geocaches are awarded points based on a ranking system of difficulty. Geocachers must find enough caches to award them 100 points.
- Once a Cache is found enter the date and code found in the cache onto the passport log sheet.

More About Geocaching

What is Geocaching?

Geocaching is a real-world, outdoor treasure hunting game using GPS-enabled devices. Participants navigate to a specific set of GPS coordinates and then attempt to find the geocache (container) hidden at that location.

How is Geocaching done?

At its simplest level, geocaching requires these 8 steps:

- 1. User must register for a free basic membership at geocaching.com
- 2. Visit the "Hide & Seek a Cache" page
- 3. Enter your postal code and click "search"
- 4. Choose any geocache from the list and click on its name
- 5. Enter the coordinates of the geocache into a GPS device
- 6. Use the GPS device to assist you in finding the hidden geocache
- 7. Sign the logbook, collect the treasure and return the geocache to its original location
- 8. Share geocaching stories and photos online
