Attend to receive assistance from trained volunteers completing your Naturalization application, Form N-400, application review from volunteer immigration attorneys, and to learn about the citizenship process.

Are you eligible?

- Must be at least 18 years old by the date you file
- Have been a lawful permanent resident for at least the last 5 years (or 3 years, if married to a U.S. • Two passport photos citizen).
- Have been present in the U.S. for 2-1/2 of the past citizen), and have not been outside the U.S. for 1 year or more within the last 5 years (or the last 3 years, if married to a U.S. citizen)
- are filing your application for at least three months
- Be able to speak, read and write ordinary English
- Be able to pass a U.S. history and government exam
- Be a person of "good moral character." This will be nature of the event, we will be unable to assist number & immigration status attendees with criminal convictions at the Prior spouse's name, date of birth, country of workshop.
- Be willing to take an oath of loyalty to the U.S.

What to bring:

- · Copies of front & back of permanent resident card (a/k/a green card)
- Money order in the amount of \$680, OR Proof of receipt of public benefits, i.e. Medicaid or 5 years (or 1-1/2 of the past 3, if married to a U.S. food stamps, or tax returns demonstrating that eligibility for low-income fee waiver, OR

If active-duty military, proof of status

- List of home addresses for last 5 years with dates • Have been a resident of the state from which you at each address; list of employment for last 5 years with dates at each employer
 - Dates of trips outside U.S. in last 5 years (or stamped passports, tickets, itineraries)
 - Names & dates of birth of parents, & names, dates of birth, A numbers & addresses of all children
- difficult to establish if you have failed to pay child Current spouse's name, date of birth, date of support, taxes, or have been convicted of certain marriage, address, employer, date became U.S. crimes, among other things. Due to the limited citizen, or if not U.S. citizen, country of birth, A
 - birth, immigration status, nationality, date of marriage, date marriage ended & how marriage ended (& the same information for your current spouse's prior spouse(s), if applicable)
