



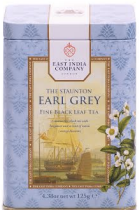

Mr. Lenadora has built his expertise of tea over a 35-year career, which he started at the age of 18 as tea planter in his native Sri Lanka. Mr. Lenadora's wealth of experience working in some of the great Sri Lankan tea estates has helped him develop an innate understanding of and expertise in the seasonal qualities of tea.



The Campbell Darjeeling: Named after The East India Company's superintendent of Darjeeling, Dr. Campbell, the second flush of this light and fragrant Darjeeling black tea has the signature muscatel flavor as well as a fruity and earthy note.



The Staunton Earl Grey: The true origins of Earl Grey tea remained a mystery until recent research in The East India Company archives revealed that the use of orange flavoring with tea was first observed in China in 1793 by Sir George Staunton, a company botanist.
