For those unfamiliar with Horizon House and its work, they are a charitable organization that provides services to those who need it most in our local communities such as those with disabilities, suffering from addiction, and the homeless. With over 120 locations in Pennsylvania alone, including 47 residential locations, Horizon House assists approximately 4,500 individuals each year!

Mike Chenail and his crew of workers arrived early in the morning at Horizon House's location in Germantown, ready to tackle the project. The house was surrounded by several trees including some extremely rare Kentucky Coffee Trees, all of which were in serious need of pruning for safety and health reasons. After nearly a full day of work,

the job was completed, Sandy Clark, a dedicated Horizon House staffer, gave us a big thank you, saying "Thank you Mike, and thank you Giroud Tree and Lawn for the exceptional work you do for and in the community.
