PROGRAM CHAIR

Harriet M. Hageman focuses her law practice on water and natural resources issues, and is licensed in Wyoming, Nebraska, and Colorado. She has worked on many water and natural resource matters, including challenges to the US Fish and Wildlife Service's management and recovery of the Canadian gray wolf and other species, protection of private property from contaminated discharges, snowmobile use in Yellowstone Park, and defense of Wyoming's "open range" law. Ms. Hageman focuses on both water quantity and water quality issues and management. She was honored as the Casper College Alumni of the Year in 2010, and has been a featured speaker for the Casper College Doornbos Lecture Series. She was inducted into the Wyoming Agriculture Hall of Fame in 2011. Ms. Hageman travels extensively throughout the country speaking on regulatory impacts, the Clean Water Act, and conservation easements.

FEATURED PRESENTERS

Jeff Fassett is the Director of the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources. Prior to coming to Nebraska, Mr. Fassett worked for HDR Engineering since 2006, and led the firm's strategic program for water rights engineering from the firm's Cheyenne, Wyoming office. His responsibilities include leveraging his 40 years of experience in water policy, water resources engineering, and water rights, to provide advice, engineering, and strategic planning to HDR clients. After serving three years as Deputy State Engineer he was appointed Wyoming State Engineer. Mr. Fassett led an agency involved with all aspects of water rights permitting, adjudications, and priority water administration, and represented the State's interests for all Interstate Compacts and USSC Decrees and for water resource policy matters for the State of Wyoming. In September 2002, Mr. Fassett was appointed by the President to be the Federal Representative and Chairman of the Red River Compact Commission involving the shared Red River water resources among Oklahoma, Texas, Arkansas, and Louisiana.

Patrick Tyrrell has been Wyoming State Engineer since 2001. He is a Wyoming native who grew up in Cheyenne, but has also lived in Casper, Gillette, and Laramie, Wyoming, and Minneapolis, Minnesota. His experience was entirely within the private sector until taking the appointment as State Engineer in January of 2001. He is past board member and past President of the Wyoming Water Association. In his role as State Engineer, Mr. Tyrrell serves as Wyoming's Commissioner to the Upper Colorado River Commission, and he represents Wyoming on the North Platte Decree Committee, the Colorado River Basin Salinity Control Forum (and its related Advisory Council), and was Chairman of the Western States Water Council from July 2014 until July 2016. Mr. Tyrrell was Wyoming's Commissioner on the Bear and Yellowstone River Commissions from 2001–2012, and was reappointed to both compact commissions in 2016.
