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Wesley Village | Community Partners Fact Sheet

In partnership with the City of Garden Grove, Jamboree Housing Corporation and the Garden Grove United Methodist Church creatively transformed a vacant lot into a vibrant community asset. Jamboree is leasing the land that, in turn, will generate revenue for the church for decades to come. In the process, various local community partners were engaged to extend their outreach into the local neighborhood. The redesigned church campus includes two three-story residential buildings for working families and seniors with a community center that permanently house the following collaboration of community partners. A third building is dedicated for the exclusive use by Orange County Head Start as a learning center.

Lestonnac Free Clinic... is deeply grateful for the continued support from Wesley Village and Garden Grove United Methodist Church which allows us to make an impact and heal our community.

LFC in Garden Grove, a satellite clinic, was opened in November 2014 operating out of the small chapel in the Garden Grove United Methodist Church. LFC has been fortunate to see a total of more than 700 patients, and provide approximately 2,400 visits to date. The services that have been performed include: physical exams, diabetic testing and education, as well as women's services. With the support of Wesley Village and Garden Grove United Methodist Church, the new Garden Grove clinic has been moved to 10861 Acacia Parkway in Garden Grove and will be open Tuesday and Saturdays from 9:00am to 12:00pm and Fridays from 9:00am to 5:00pm, with a lunch hour from 12:00pm to 1:00pm.

ABOUT: Lestonnac Free Clinic was founded in 1979 by Sister Marie Therese. LFC is one of the few remaining free clinics in the state of California. LFC provides free health care services to the low-income, homeless, and uninsured in Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino counties. Over the past eight years, LFC has also expanded its service area and opened 13, thirty-hours per week, satellite locations in Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside and San Bernardino counties. Additionally, in an effort to further increase its outreach to underserved communities, LFC participates and organizes an average of 10 annual health fairs in Orange and San Bernardino Counties.

Under the vision of LFC's Executive Director, Ed Gerber, and through the dedication of over 224 volunteer providers, as well as 120 clinical and administrative volunteers, including students and doctors from Kaiser Permanente, and University of California, Irvine, LFC continues to offer primary, specialty care, vision, dental, and counseling services for free. Services vary per location. LFC strives to ensure that no one forgoes medical services due to cost.
