Create + Construct Symposium Explores Resiliency and Building Performance in New York City October 15

Simpson Gumpertz & Heger's all-day technical event convenes AEC thought leaders to discuss resilient and better-performing buildings, infrastructure, and communities

New York, NY; September 19, 2019 – Simpson Gumpertz & Heger (SGH) will convene a diverse group of architectural, engineering, and construction (AEC) experts with building owners and city officials for a full-day discussion on resiliency and building performance. - A panel discussion with local executives on planning for a more resilient future.
- Networking opportunities with peers and industry thought leaders.
