Clinical trials (also called "clinical studies" or "research studies") are conducted to collect safety and efficacy data for investigational drugs, medical devices, diagnostics, and other health-related products. These studies offer a way for almost anyone — regardless of age, ethnicity, or background — to help move science forward. Eligible participants usually receive compensation for study-related time and travel. These studies also offer more care options for patients suffering from common, unique, and rare health conditions.

The site will be Meridian's eleventh in Nebraska, and follows the company's opening of a cardiology research clinic in Lincoln earlier this year. Meridian now has 37 sites nationwide. The company was founded in 1999 and has enrolled more than 85,000 participants into clinical trials since its inception.
