**POW!** (**Purveyors of Wonder**) **Entertainment** is an <u>American</u> media production company formed by Gill Champion, Arthur Lieberman and former <u>Marvel Comics</u> editor and publisher <u>Stan Lee</u> in 2001 as a limited liability company founded with assets taken from the estate of Stan Lee Media Inc, while it was in Chapter 11 Bankruptcy protection.

POW! productions include the 2006 <u>Sci Fi Channel</u>'s TV-movie *Stan Lee's Lightspeed* and that network's <u>reality television</u> series <u>Who Wants to Be a Superhero?</u>. Other productions include the <u>direct-to-DVD</u> animated features <u>Stan Lee's Mosaic</u> and <u>Stan Lee Presents: The Condor</u>.

In 2005, the company announced that another animated film that would feature the voice of <u>Ringo</u> <u>Starr.[1][2]</u>

Also in early 2005, the company formed a strategic partnership to develop a new mobile channel with mobile-streaming pioneer <u>Vidiator</u>, through Vidiator's state-of-the-art Xenon mobile streaming technology. In 2006, this resulted in an agreement with <u>Sprint Nextel</u> Corp. where the Stan Lee's POW! Mobile Channel is officially listed as Sprint's Channel 70.[3] The channel includes mobisodes with <u>Stripperella</u>, The Accuser and The Drifter.

On <u>March 15</u>, <u>2007</u>, <u>Stan Lee Media</u> filed a lawsuit against <u>Marvel Entertainment</u> for \$5 billion, claiming that the company is co-owner of the characters that Lee created for Marvel. Lee, however, is no longer

associated with Stan Lee Media.[4] And on June 9, 2007, Stan Lee Media is suing Stan Lee, his newer company, POW Entertainment, subsidiary QED Entertainment, and other former Stan Lee Media staff at POW.[5]

<u>Brighton Partners</u> and <u>Rainmaker Animation</u> announced in April 2008 a partnership with Lee's POW! Entertainment to produce a CGI film series, "<u>Legion of 5</u>".[6] That same month, <u>Virgin Comics</u> announced Lee would create a line of superhero comics for that company.[7]
