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the journey

Days 1 & 2 Calvi and the Balagne

This morning, we're off into the Balagne, the tranquil countryside surrounding Calvi, and its Strada di l'Artigiani artisans' towns. We'll hike from village to village along medieval trails, stopping en route to explore the gorgeous checkerboard façade of Aregno's Romanesque Trinità church. The high point of today's route is the hilltop gem of Sant'Antoninu, officially one of France's Most Beautiful Towns. Its winding cobblestone alleys were strictly meant for donkeys, while its stunning 360-degree views of the Mediterranean and Montegrossu peak may well make your head spin. We then stroll down into Pigna, another perfectly preserved town where we experience firsthand Corsica's artisan tradition, meeting craftspeople (potters, instrumentmakers, painters and musicians) who chose to make the village home and to ply their age-old crafts with passion. Then it's on to Corbara and its surprisingly rich baroque treasures, or perhaps a café in the shade. In the afternoon, keen hikers can opt to continue hiking on to the picturesque village of Santa Reparata, then down to Île Rousse. Tonight, we'll gather for a Cap Corse or Muscat aperitif before our poolside dinner at our hotel's renowned L'Alivu restaurant, a proud bearer of two Michelin stars.

You're never far from the sea on Corsica, and indeed our next day is all about the coastline: sea views, coastal walking and seaside dining. We climb with the sun up to the chapel of Notre Dame de la Serra for a commanding

The trail then leads down to the tip of the Punta della Revellata, a rocky headland covered with sweet-scented wild flowers. Be sure to bring along your swimsuit; its lonely azure coves are awfully enticing! You could opt to bring along a picnic today, to snack by the sea, or continue back to Calvi for a wealth of options (perhaps on the port in the shadow of the dancing yachts?). After lunch, we'll wander through Calvi's Genoese citadel, purportedly the birthplace of Christopher Columbus. Tip your hat to the white-képied French Foreign Legionnaires, as the city is also home to an elite paratrooper regiment, while its palm-shaded quayside below has been a hangout for the European glitterati since the 1950s. Stroll and shop or just peoplewatch, then decide if you'd rather hop a van shuttle back to the hotel or complete the loop with one last climb. Tonight, we head to a hidden locals-only spot for a dinner of freshly caught seafood and fantastic meats and vegetables beside the lapping waves.

Hôtel La Villa, Calvi Relais & Châteaux

Proudly perched on the hillside above Calvi, this sumptuous Relais & Châteaux hotel is ideally situated for gazing at the mountains, bay and citadel while lounging by one of the many pools. We love the understated elegance of its lounge and bistro, while the poolside restaurant l'Alivu has earned its stars.

THE WALKING

Day 1: An 8 km (5 mi.) walk on rocky paths between villages; optional afternoon trail hike adds up to another 8 km. *Day 2:* A 14 km (9 mi.) walk down to Calvi and beyond with some good climbs on dirt roads and narrow trails. The afternoon option back to the hotel extends your daily distance to 18 km (11 mi.).

Day 3 Into the Alta Rocca

Today begins with a full morning, scenic drive via private coach inland to Corsica's heart, the 2,100-metre (7,000-foot) mountains of Corsica's Alta Rocca region and Natural Regional Park. We'll stop for lunch in the stark granite village of Zonza, nestled against a dramatic mountain backdrop. Some say the alma corsa (the Corsican soul) resides here. After a lunch of mountain specialties, we'll head off on a trail following a quiet river valley and then climbing gently among boulders in the forest. In the middle of the wilderness we'll rendezvous with a local guide and explore a site from the dawn of human life on the island: the mysterious Bronze-age cyclopean castle of Cucuruzzu. After a glimpse back into prehistory, a meadow stroll brings us to our mountain home for the evening. The heated indoor pool and steam room feel fantastic after a day of hiking! Our dinner tonight will be at our hotel's wonderful restaurant, known far and wide for delicious Corsican fare. Some mountain surprises are in store for this very special evening at altitude!

HOTEL

A Pignata, Levie

This elegant little family-run hotel perches in a tranquil mountain clearing. The simple yet elegant rooms, while of modest size, capture the sense of place with a true sense of chic. The heated indoor pool and steam room are the perfect end to a long day, while their renowned restaurant is the ideal setting for a festive Corsican evening.

Day 3: A 10 km (6 mi.) gently rolling mountain trail hike at altitude, with a (pre)historic detour.



Days 4 & 5 Bavedda to Bonifacio

This morning, we enjoy a traditional mountain breakfast and then head out for the most dramatic hike of the week, in the heart of the mountains at the Bocca di Bavedda (Bavella Pass). This pass is famous for its spectacular larch pines, which can reach six metres in circumference and 50 metres in height. Used for masts since ancient times, some are over 1,000 years old. An amazing panorama of peaks and forests acts as the perfect backdrop to our walk, not to mention the needle-like Aiguilles de Bavedda. These jagged, pink-toned rock formations that dominate the landscape are a marvel, and were a favourite subject for early landscape artists. A portion of our walk will take us along the GR20 (Grande Randonnée hiking trail) which traverses Corsica from north to south and is said to be some of the most spectacular hiking in all of Western Europe; today's hike supports the claim, with views down to the Mediterranean on clear days. After a savoury picnic lunch with our mountain guides, we'll loop back to Bavedda along a different path-and with a little luck, can spot

Winding on down to our seaside hotel, you can hardly believe that a few hours earlier we were in the mountains surrounded by granite and pines... this is the magic of Corsica! We head out to dinner in the seaside town of Porto Vecchio. Delicious, creative cuisine with the bay's twinkling lights—what a wonderful finish!

On our final day, spectacular scenery unfolds as we discover the most stunning part of the island: a coast of towering white cliffs, translucent turquoise waters and rolling green hills billowing up to pine forests. But the real gem awaits; perched on the edge of 30-metre-high white limestone cliffs overlooking the Mediterranean, the Citadel of Bonifacio-one of the Mediterranean's most impenetrable fortresses-surrounds the old town. Traced in the cliffs we see the King of Aragón's Staircase, supposedly carved out of the limestone one night when hopeful invaders thought they had found a chink in its armour. You'll reach the city in time for lunch at one of the many little restaurants in the old town-perhaps aubergines à la Bonifacienne, or Corsican soup? We'll then rendezvous with local guide Pierre for a personal visit. A Bonifacio native, Pierre is a friend of B&R who takes great pleasure in sharing his passion for his hometown-he can thank his British mother for his Queen's English, but his brooding Corsican charm is all his own. He'll lead us into the labyrinth of the town's medieval cobblestoned streets and through maze-like passageways as Bonifacio's history begins to unfold through its exquisitely varied architecture. From prehistory to the Genoese, Pisans, Spanish and then French, the story is a colourful one. If you're longing to take a dip in those inviting azure waters, consider the optional afternoon walk that travels on old footpaths out to a secluded cove or two. Or perhaps find a café on the port where colourful boats and enormous yachts bob up and down and enjoy a cool Pietra or Colomba— Corsican beers brewed from chestnuts and wild herbs. In the late afternoon, we rendezvous with Captain Fréderic: all aboard our private motor boats for a sea-level view of this stunning town. Blowing kisses to the white cliffs of Bonifacio, we're off on a little coastal cruise back north to Porto Vecchio. After a good dose of sun, sea and maybe a splash in the protected pure-blue waters, we'll dock at our hotel in plenty of time for celebratory cocktails. Tonight we're in Chef Davide Bisetto's creative hands at the hotel's fine restaurant, a luscious finish to celebrate a week of Corsican adventures!

After a last seaside breakfast, we'll drop you off at the Figari airport for connecting flights. *Bon voyage!*

The Isle of Beauty



Corsica is a place almost outside of time: rich and complex, beautiful, tempting and ineffably different. It gives life and breath to the phrase "an island unto itself."

We'll enjoy some rolling walks with less sustained climbs in the Balagne region, and then tackle high mountains at Bavedda with a guide; rewarding views are guaranteed! Our last day is gentler, with one good climb. Daily distances range from 5 to 14 kilometres, with options for shorter or longer walks available most days.

How do I get to Calvi?

Your likely point of arrival into France will be Paris. Flights from Paris take about an hour and a half. There is usually one direct flight a day departing from Orly (ORY) airport. Remember to allow yourself plenty of time if you have to change airports in Paris. The Calvi airport is about ten minutes from the centre of town or our rendezvous hotel. Taxis are the best means to reach Calvi from the airport, or you can make a request to the hotel that a car and driver meet you; there will be a fee for this service.


