Robert W. Brenner, MD, MMM, is Chief Medical Officer of Summit Medical Group in Berkeley Heights, New Jersey.

Before joining Summit Medical Group as Medical Director in 2006, Dr. Brenner was a lead hospital administrator and Chairman of Family Medicine with Atlantic Health System at Mountainside Hospital in Mountainside, New Jersey. Under his direction, the Mountainside Hospital Family Practice Residency Program became one of the most competitive residencies in New Jersey. He also has been Director of the Outpatient Ambulatory Center and Associate Residency Director at Somerset Medical Center in Somerset, New Jersey, and a physician in private practice in Westfield, New Jersey.
