

Medicare PECOS Re-validation Analysis System - mCARE

As a part of the Affordable Care Act (section 6401a) The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) have implemented new screening criteria for the Medicare provider enrollment process. Initiated in 2011, The Medicare Re-validation initiative is whereby CMS re-validates a provider's credentials through their online enrollment system; PECOS. The process is as follows:

- CMS sends a re-validation request to a provider
- Upon receipt of the re-validation request, the provider has 60 days from the date of the letter to submit all applicable re-validation forms
- Failure to submit the re-validation forms will result in the provider being deemed non-participating in Medicare and therefore unable to bill Medicare for patient services

While the Medicare Re-validation initiative has reduced fraud, waste, and abuse in the Medicare system, healthcare organizations have had a difficult time complying with the tedious re-validation process. Many healthcare organizations are realizing that their providers have not complied only after their Medicare billing privileges have been terminated

Providers Who Have Not Responded to Medicare's Re-validation Letter

- mCARE will scrub the providers listed in PECOS and identify which
 providers have received re-validation letters but have not responded and
 are at risk of being terminated by Medicare and therefore unable to bill
 Medicare
- mCARE will send you an encrypted report on a monthly basis indicating which providers are going to be terminated
- In the event that you want Newport to research and adjudicate the revalidation issue, Newport may partner with you to work with Medicare to prevent termination

Providers Not Listed in PECOS

- mCARE will scrub Medicare's PECOS list to identify whether or not your providers are listed in PECOS
- If a provider is identified as not listed in PECOS, mCARE will send you an
 encrypted report on a monthly basis indicating which provider(s) need to be
 enrolled in PECOS
- In the event that you want Newport to enroll your provider(s) in PECOS,
 Newport may partner with you to enroll your providers in PECOS
