The Center for Family Success works with families to improve outcomes for children of criminal justice involved parents. The Center supports stable, healthy families through evidence-based programs that meet client needs and produce reliable, repeatable results; through parenting education, client advocacy and home visiting; with family engagement activities; and by creating partnerships that enhance collaboration. The Center has been serving clients in the Rockwood neighborhood since 2007.

Pathfinders of Oregon has been working with criminal justice involved clients for twenty years to break the cycle of criminality. Pathfinders has provided programs and services in Oregon's prisons and in the community to more than 35,000 Oregonians impacted by criminal justice involvement.

#### Healthy Relationships: Successful Families (HRSF)

Healthy Relationships: Successful Families is a family violence prevention program based on new research that emphasizes the importance of the dynamic between members of a couple. HRSF helps parents to understand the impact of family violence on their children, and to develop positive relationship skills and behaviors. HRSF is a 24-hour, 12-week class with an optional parent support group.

#### Parenting Inside Out (PIO)

Parenting Inside Out is an evidence based parenting skills program developed for systems involved families. PIO is based on Parent Management Training, a proven program that appears on multiple national best practices lists.

PIO is a 48-hour, 12-week program that covers topics including communication skills, problem solving skills, ages and stages of child development, non-violent discipline and setting boundaries, positive encouragement and supervision and monitoring.
