Important Things to Consider

Not all home security systems and companies are created equal. One company may be known for having the best customer service while another is known for its quick and easy installation. Others may be a combination. Below are several things to keep an eye out for while looking for your new security system.

Installation Method

There are generally two types of installation methods. The most well known is the "professional" or technician installation where a representative from the security company comes to your home to install your system. The other is a Do It Yourself security system installation, which is becoming the most common method.

Do It Yourself installations are extremely quick and easy. Your system is pre-programmed and shipped to your door. All you need to do is plug in your Control Panel (the "brain" of the system), place your wireless sensors, and call the company to have your system activated. This usually takes about 30 minutes. Unless you're physically unable to perform a DIY installation this is the recommended method.

Technician installations are certainly easy on you. You don't have to do anything! However, you may end up waiting around for the technician to arrive and it could take him all day to install the system depending on whether it's wireless or hard-wired. If it's a hard-wired system there could also be accidental damage to your home. Lastly, technician installations will cost extra most of the time. Money you can save by performing a free DIY installation.

Wireless vs. Hard-Wired

For years many people thought wireless security systems were less reliable and took too much maintenance. While this may have been true ten years ago, it isn't today. Wireless systems are extremely simple to install and even easier to manage.

You won't have to worry about running wires, damage to your home, or having a technician come out to replace a sensor if it goes bad. Replacing parts is a breeze and few and far between, as many wireless security systems are designed to last ten years or more.

Hard-wired security systems are certainly reliable, or else they wouldn't have been used for so long! However, like we said above they can be intrusive and be more trouble than they are worth.

Cameras vs. No Cameras

Before the rise of wireless security systems cameras were a bit of a luxury when it came to home security. Only the rich and famous could have high quality, remotely viewable cameras. These days, installing wireless cameras is a breeze.

All that is required to have cameras is a high speed, wireless Internet connection. After installing cameras you will be able to view them while away from home on a computer or even your smartphone! Want to keep an eye on the dog? Want to check in on the kids after school? Wireless cameras make it simple and easy.

While cameras are not a security device per se, they are extremely helpful. They are by no means a necessity when it comes to securing your home, but can add an extra layer of comfort knowing you have the ability to look in on your home from anywhere, anytime.

Cellular vs. Phone/Broadband

When talking about a cellular, phone line, or broadband security system we're talking about the way the system is monitored. Your security system needs a way to communicate to the monitoring station, and these are the three main methods. Cellular security systems are by far the most reliable.

Most cellular security systems have a built in cellular device that transmits alarm signals to the monitoring station in the event of an emergency. These signals are sent in a matter of seconds, and also allow you to "connect" with your security system from your smartphone or a computer so you can alter settings or check on things. Most importantly, intruders can't simply cut a phone line or internet line outside of your home to easily defeat your security system.

Phone line security systems are monitored using your home's standard landline phone. With many newer homes the phone line is underground, yet may still be accessible outside of your home. Broadband systems may be the most unreliable, as your Internet can go out at any time.



Types of Security Systems

Having options when it comes to your home security system purchase is always a plus. Good thing for you that security companies have stepped up their game. There are a few different types of security systems you can choose from all with their own unique benefits.

A few aspects of these security systems may roll together as well, meaning you can have a DIY security system that is also a wireless security system and uses cellular monitoring. Below are the main types of security systems.



The first thing you should do when shopping for a security system is read expert and consumer reviews. These reviews can give you great insight into each company and what they offer which will help you narrow down your list of candidates.

Once you've read reviews it's best to call a few companies to ask questions, get pricing and compare quotes. It's not best practice to only call one company. Unless you are completely blown away by what they're offering you should always call at least one other company.

Lastly, it's probably a good idea to ask to see the security-monitoring contract before committing or making the purchase. While you often don't actually sign the agreement until after you have paid, it's best to look it over beforehand so you're not put on the spot when the time comes. Most of the stuff in the contract won't mean much to you, but at least you'll have a chance to glance over it before making your decision.

Comparing Quotes

Comparing security system quotes can be like reading two different maps of the same area and still getting lost. The first thing to remember when comparing quotes is that you are comparing apples to apples.
